**STRATEGIC IMPACT - MAKING A DIFFERENCE FORUM**  
**SESSION 1: A VISION FOR MAKING DISCIPLES**

- Before Jesus left this earth after His resurrection, He gave clear instructions about what He wanted His disciples in His church to do.
- His priority command is called the **Great Commission** and is found stated in different ways in 5 different places in the New Testament (Matthew 28:18-20; Mark 16:15; Luke 24:45-47; John 20:21; Acts 1:8).
- We are going to look in detail at the Great Commission passage in Matthew 28:18-20.

I. The **authority** of Jesus **compels** us to do what He wants, (Matthew 28:18).

II. The **command** of Jesus **clarifies** what we are to do, (Matthew 28:19).

A. The **only command** in this verse is to **make disciples**; the rest of the actions describe **HOW** we are to make disciples.

B. The command to **make disciples** must be the top priority for us in our ministry.

1. It is Christ's top priority for His church until He returns.

2. We should never stop making multiplying disciples as long as we live.

III. The **presence** of Jesus gives us **confidence** that we can accomplish His command.

**Conclusion:**

- If you and your church are not producing multiplying disciples, you are not doing what Christ commands (Colossians 1:23-29).

- *Will you commit to giving your life to continually making multiply disciples of Jesus?*

**STRATEGIC IMPACT - MAKING A DIFFERENCE FORUM**  
**SESSION 2: TELLING YOUR STORY (PERSONAL TESTIMONY)**

- In Acts 1:8 Jesus says that we will be his witnesses everywhere in the power of His Holy Spirit.
  - A witness is someone who tells what they have seen, heard or experienced.
  - You have a story about your experience with Jesus. This is your testimony about how He has changed your life.
  - You can expect the Holy Spirit to use your testimony in a powerful way as you tell how Jesus has changed your life.
- Paul tells his testimony in Acts 26:2-29 and gives us a pattern we can use to prepare and share our own testimony.

**Optional Audience Participation** Gather in groups of 3 to read and discuss Acts 26:2-29 using the following questions:

- How did Paul describe his life before he met Jesus (before he became a Christian)?
- How did Paul describe how he met Jesus (how he became a Christian)?
- How did Paul describe his life after he met Jesus (after he became a Christian)?
- What impact did Paul's testimony have on those who heard it?

- **Your story (testimony)** is one of your most powerful tools to tell others about Jesus. It is your unique personal experience with Jesus and the Lord will use it to impact many others and open doors to tell **Jesus' story (the Gospel)**.
- Here are **guidelines** as you prepare your personal story (testimony) to share with others:
  - I. As a witness for Christ we **initiate** relationships with others and begin with **"their story"** — ask questions about their beliefs and relationship to God. Examples:
    - A. "Do you believe in God? Why, or why not?"
    - B. "How would you describe your relationship to God? Do you feel far away or close to Him?"
    - C. "What do you think keeps you from having a great relationship with God?"
    - D. "Who, in your understanding, is Jesus Christ?"
    - E. "Why do you think Jesus came to earth and willingly die on a cross?"
    - F. "What do you think you would need to do to have a great relationship with God?"
    - G. "What do you think God requires of you to be sure you will have eternal life?"
  - II. As you get to know the other person, **ask permission** to tell them the difference that Jesus has made in your life (your story). Your story **must**:
    - A. **Be brief** — no more than one or two minutes.
    - B. **Be conversational** — not a sermon, but a dialogue, using a normal conversational tone.
    - C. **Not use religious or theological words** that people do not understand.
    - D. **Not** be about your church or other non-essential issues: moral issues, politics, etc.
    - E. **Be about Jesus and what He has done in your life!**



**STRATEGIC IMPACT - MAKING A DIFFERENCE FORUM**  
**SESSION 3: THE ESSENCE OF THE GOSPEL**

- Everything we do in *STRATEGIC IMPACT* must result in people hearing about Jesus — taking the Good News of the gospel of Jesus Christ to a lost world.
- Our goal is not to only have a training event, but that you will practice personally sharing your faith as a lifestyle — and others you train will, as well.
- We are often surprised that Christians — even pastors and leaders — are confused about what the **essence** of the Gospel message is and **how** to share it with others simply and clearly so that they might have eternal life in Christ.
- Today we will review the **clear** and **simple** Gospel message and provide an effective tool to help you share it with others.
- Lastly, we are going to GO OUT into the community and share this message with people.

**THE ESSENCE OF THE GOSPEL**

**I. The essence of the Gospel is FAITH in the substitutionary DEATH, physical BURIAL and bodily RESURRECTION of Jesus Christ (1 Corinthians 15:1-4).**

A. Paul defines the basic elements of the Gospel message that he shared with lost people:

1. Jesus Christ died for our sins.
2. He was physically buried.
3. He was bodily raised from the dead on the third day.
4. Those who put their faith in Jesus Christ as their personal Savior will have their sins forgiven and obtain eternal life. (1 Corinthians 15:1-2, 51-53)

B. We must be careful that we do not **confuse** people about what they must believe to be saved!

**II. We must make clear to people the ESSENTIAL ELEMENTS of the Gospel and give them a clear opportunity to respond with faith in Jesus as the only way to have eternal life.**

A. Essential Elements of the Gospel Message:


1. God's love for people in the world (John 3:16).
  2. Our sin (Romans 3:23, 6:23).
  3. Jesus Christ's death, burial, and resurrection — the only way to God (John 14:6; Romans 5:8; 1 Corinthians 5:3-8; 1 Timothy 2:5; 1 John 5:11-12).
  4. God's offer of salvation as a gift by grace through faith in Jesus Christ (John 1:12; Romans 10:9-10; Ephesians 2:8-9).
- B. Paul himself asked for prayer that he would have opportunity to share the Gospel and that he could make it very clear to those he spoke (Ephesians 6:19-20; Colossians 4:3-4).
- C. We too must take every opportunity to personally share the simple Gospel of Jesus Christ with as many as we can!

**A SIMPLE TOOL TO SHARE THE ESSENCE OF THE GOSPEL**

**III. The *STRATEGIC IMPACT GOSPEL SHARING TOOL* is designed to help you share this simple Gospel message and give others an opportunity to put their faith in Christ.**





1. **Share YOUR STORY (TESTIMONY) of:**
  - What your life was like BEFORE you trusted Jesus,
  - How you came to place FAITH in Jesus as your Savior
  - How your life was different AFTER trusting in Jesus for salvation.

**Show them the front panel of the tool.**

**Say:** “May I ask you a few question about what you believe and show you from the Bible how you can be certain that you have eternal life?”

2. Show them the triangle and tell them this figure represents God. Ask, “**Do you believe in God? Do you believe that He loves you?**” Wait for the person’s answer. These questions will enable you to have a **conversation** with the person instead of just talking at them.
3. It is **important to read the verse from the Bible** along with each figure. Begin with **John 3:16. (1)**
  - Ask if the person has a Bible. If they do, have them get it and help them look up the verses in the Bible.
  - It would be best if the person reads the verses. However, be sensitive if they cannot read. If they hesitate or say something like “I do not have my glasses,” then you read it for them.
4. Show them the figure of the person at the bottom of the first panel. Ask, “**Who do you think this represents?**” They might say, “People,” or “the devil” or some other person. Tell them that this figure represents everyone in the world — you, me and everyone else. Point out the black gulf, which indicates that people are separated from God. Read **Romans 3:23 (2)** and ask, “**The Bible says that we are separated from God because each of us has sinned. Do you believe that you have sinned against God?**”
5. Read **Romans 6:23 (3)** in the dark area showing people separated from God. Ask, “**Do you believe that your sins cause death — eternal separation from God?**”



6. Turn to the next panel showing the cross. Read *Romans 5:8* (4) and say, “**God loves us and has provided a way for us to know Him by sending His Son, Jesus Christ, to die on the cross to pay for our sins. Do you believe Jesus died on the cross for you?**”
7. Read *John 14:6* (5) and ask, “**Do you believe that Jesus Christ is the only way to have eternal life with God?**”
8. Read *1 Corinthians 15:3-8* (6) and ask, “**Do you believe that God raised Jesus from the dead?**”
9. Turn to the third panel and show them the picture of the gift and say, “**God wants you to have eternal life with Him and He offers this as a free gift.**” Then read *Ephesians 2:8-9* (7) say, “**If you believe on the name of Jesus, God offers you to become a child of God**” Then read *John 1:12* (8).
10. “**God says this to those who reject His gift:**” read (*2 Thessalonians 1:8-10*) (9). But, “**If you accept this gift by faith, God promises you will have eternal life with Him.**” (*1 John 5:11-12*) (10).
11. ASK: A. “**Do you reasonably understand this?**”  
B. “**Do you believe this is true?**”  
C. “**Would you like to receive the gift of eternal life by faith in Jesus Christ today?**”
12. If they answer “**Yes,**” then read *Romans 10:9-10* (11). You can receive Christ by faith today by **believing** in your heart and **confessing** with your mouth. Prayer does not save you. It is your **faith in Christ** that saves you. The words of a prayer can help you express your faith. Here is a sample prayer: “*Lord Jesus, I need You. I admit that I have sinned against you. Please forgive my sins. I accept Your free gift of forgiveness of sins and eternal life today by faith. In Jesus’ name, Amen.*”
13. After someone accepts God’s free gift of eternal life by faith, ask, “**Did you trust in Christ to forgive your sins and give you eternal life?**” Then encourage them in their new faith and pray for them.

15. If possible, set a time to meet with them tomorrow to begin discipling the new believer using the *SI DISCIPLESHIP TOOL*.

16. Turn in the contact information to the leader of the new church that is being planted.

**SESSION 4: THE ESSENCE OF DISCIPLESHIP: DISCIPLESHIP TRAINING**

- When you faithfully share the Gospel with people, there will be those who respond and trust in Christ as their Savior.
- It is vitally important to establish these new believers in their new faith in Christ, and then help them grow into maturing and multiplying disciples. This is different than preaching or placing them in a class at church. This is a time to develop a personal discipling relationship with the new believer so they can be grounded in the basic foundations of the faith.

### **IMPORTANCE OF PERSONALLY DISCIPLING THE NEW BELIEVERS**

- I. **We must VISIT new believers to disciple them where they LIVE, WORK, and go about their DAILY LIVES.**
  - A. We must **go** to them and not expect them to come to us.
  - B. Disciple new believers individually or in small groups of 2 to 5 people.

### **A PRACTICAL AND REPRODUCIBLE DISCIPLING TOOL**

- II. **Begin by using the guidelines and 4 topics for 4 “Foundational” visits on the *STRATEGIC IMPACT DISCIPLESHIP TOOL*.”**
  - A. **If possible**, make the first visit within 48 hours after the person receives Christ.
  - B. **If possible**, offer them (at least) a Gospel of John to read.
- III. **After the first 4 Visits, ask the “faithful” disciples to continue to meet with you for further growth and discipleship.**
  - A. If possible, provide a New Testament as a gift for completing the first four visits.
  - B. Ask them to continue to meet with you to grow in their faith using the “Growth Visits” on *STRATEGIC IMPACT DISCIPLESHIP TOOL*.

## CONCLUSION:

- It is not enough just to share the gospel and get people to profess faith in Christ. Jesus did not command us to go and get decisions, but to “go and make disciples.”
- It is not sufficient to just invite new believers to your church. You must help them personally in their new faith. We must give individual attention to new believers to help them grow into maturing and multiplying disciples.
- Will you and your team commit to personally discipling the people you lead to faith in Christ? HOW and WHEN?

# SI DISCIPLESHIP TOOL V2.1



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## 5 STEPS

1. **RELATE:** Ask how they are doing and find out what has been happening in their lives since your last meeting.
2. **ENCOURAGE:** Begin your time mutually answering Spiritual Growth Questions (based on Galatians 5:22-23). **This week...**
  - A. *Have you submitted to the Holy Spirit and maintained a passionate love for Jesus?*
  - B. *Have you walked in love, peace, patience, kindness, and forgiveness in your relationships with family, friends, fellow believers, neighbors, and enemies?*
  - C. *Have you grown in your love and devotion to Christ this week? How?*
  - D. *Did you exercise self control and honor Christ in your financial dealings?*
  - E. *Did you exercise self control over sexual thoughts and actions, and any addictive behavior?*
  - F. *Were you faithful to witness to the lost and disciple others? Who?*
  - G. *Were you faithful to complete your Bible reading and “I WILL” commitment(s) this week?*
3. **DISCUSS:** Read and discuss the Bible passage assigned to that visit’s topic using the following 6 question format provided in the next panel.
4. **PLAN:** Agree on a portion of the Bible that you will read during the week. (3 chapters per day is suggested).
5. **PRAY:** Conclude your time by praying together for each other and the commitments made from Questions 5 and 6.

## Follow this 5 step process when you meet together:

1. **RELATE:** Ask how they are doing and find out what has been happening in their lives since your last meeting.
2. **ENCOURAGE:** Continue your time together by mutually answering encouragement/accountability questions:
  - a. Did you spend time alone with God in the Bible and prayer every day since we last met? What did God say to you?
  - b. Have you walked in love in your important relationships with others in your family, friends, neighbors, and church?
  - c. Have you given into an addictive behavior?
  - d. Did you complete the commitments that you made from our Bible study last time? How?
3. **DISCUSS:** Read and discuss the Bible passage assigned to each visit's topic using the 6 Question format (the instructions are on the *DISCIPLESHIP TOOL*).
  - a. Have new disciples break into groups of 3 and use the 6 questions (shown below) to do **Visit 1**. Be certain everyone understands how to use the 6 Questions.
  - b. Go through **Visit 1:** "Who is Jesus?" based on John 11:17-27.
  - c. Make sure everyone feels comfortable discussing the questions together based on the passage of Scripture. [NOTE: This is **not** the place for a sermon. You are helping the new believers learn how to study and apply the Scriptures in their lives.]

4. **PLAN:** Agree on a portion of Scripture that each will read individually during the week. (3 chapters per day is suggested).
- Be sensitive to those who do not know how to read.
  - Provide alternatives like audio Bibles if possible.
  - Be certain to write down the answers from Questions 5 and 6 for follow up in your next visit.
  - Schedule your next **discipleship visit**.
  - Observe who is committed and faithful to participate — doing the reading at home and ready to learn more about Christ and to share Jesus with others. THESE are the people whom you should continue the discipleship relationship with after the initial 4 Visits.
5. **PRAY:** Conclude your time by praying together for each other and the commitments made from Questions 5 and 6.

**SESSION 5: MULTIPLY TO THE 4TH GENERATION**

#### **4<sup>th</sup> GENERATION MULTIPLICATION**

I. 4<sup>th</sup> Generation Multiplication is the key to saturating your community with the Gospel because it will bring about exponential multiplication.

II. Multiplication is based on the four generation strategy of 2 Timothy 2:2.

**1<sup>st</sup> Generation: Paul** discipled

**2<sup>nd</sup> Generation: Timothy** (and many others)

**3<sup>rd</sup> Generation: Faithful People** (who were entrusted with what Timothy had learned)

**4<sup>th</sup> Generation: Others Also** (who were taught by the Faithful People)

III. This 4<sup>th</sup> Generation Multiplication cycle should never stop. Every succeeding generation of disciples should step into the 1<sup>st</sup> **Generation role** and **multiply** to the **4<sup>th</sup> Generation**.

IV. The *STRATEGIC IMPACT MINISTRY MAP* helps you track multiplication to the 4<sup>th</sup> Generation.

A. You can have several different *MINISTRY MAPS* for different levels of multiplication (disciples, churches, leaders/church planters, movements).


B. When you finish one map, begin a new one!

The *MINISTRY MAP* on the last page is designed to both help you “see” this process of multiplication and to help you track your own multiplication to the 4<sup>th</sup> Generation. Please remove it from your booklet. You may keep the *MINISTRY MAP* in your Bible or journal to regularly remind you to multiply at every level... and to remind you to pray for those you are discipling and the men and women they are discipling. **NOTE:** The *MINISTRY MAP* is designed to be simple enough to reproduce easily on a blank piece of paper, napkin, notebook page, or even drawn in the dirt with your finger to show others the principle of 4<sup>th</sup> Generation Multiplication.

### Suggested Illustration

Select volunteers to come forward to fill each role of 1<sup>st</sup> Generation, 2<sup>nd</sup> Generation, etc. to physically demonstrate the *MINISTRY MAP*, 4<sup>th</sup> Generation Multiplication, and exponential growth. With each Generation demonstrated, point back to the *MINISTRY MAP* to show the correlation.

- Select a leader to be Generation 1. Have them stand at the front.
- Select two more leaders to be Generation 2. Have them stand in front of Generation 1. Have Generation 1 place his hands on their shoulders.
- Select four more leaders to be Generation 3. Have them stand in front of Generation 2. Have each Generation 2 place their hands on the shoulders of two of the Generation 2 leaders.
- Select eight more leaders to be Generation 4. Have them stand in front of Generation 3. Have each Generation 3 place their hands on the shoulders of two of the Generation 3 leaders.



When your *MINISTRY MAP* is complete, it should look like this:

## **HOW TO USE THE STRATEGIC IMPACT MINISTRY MAP**

1. **1<sup>st</sup> Generation** — Write your name on the line in the center of the page. You are the 1<sup>st</sup> Generation multiplier.
  - The entire page makes **one rectangle**. **One multiplier** for the Kingdom — **YOU**.
  
2. **2<sup>nd</sup> Generation** — Fold the *MINISTRY MAP* in half so that the fold cuts across your name. The names of the 2 people you will disciple (your “**Timothy’s**”) will be written on the lines at the end of your name. They are the 2<sup>nd</sup> Generation multipliers.
  - We now have **three rectangles**. The entire page (you), and both halves of the page with the fold (each of your 2<sup>nd</sup> Generation multipliers). **Three multipliers** for the Kingdom — You and both of your 2<sup>nd</sup> Generation.
  
3. **3<sup>rd</sup> Generation** — Fold the *MINISTRY MAP* again so that the fold cuts across the names of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Generation multipliers. Your 2<sup>nd</sup> Generation should be trained and encouraged to begin to disciple the 3<sup>rd</sup> Generation (**Faithful People**). This would be **your** 3<sup>rd</sup> Generation.
  - We now have **seven rectangles**. The entire page (you), both halves of the page with the fold (each of your 2<sup>nd</sup> Generation multipliers), and the other rectangles made by the folds. **Seven multipliers** for the Kingdom — You, both of your 2<sup>nd</sup> Generation multipliers, and the four 3<sup>rd</sup> Generation multipliers!
  
4. **4<sup>th</sup> Generation** — Continue the process with your 4<sup>th</sup> Generation (**Others Also**) as your 3<sup>rd</sup> Generation multipliers are trained and encouraged to multiply by your 2<sup>nd</sup> Generation multipliers.
  - When all of the 4<sup>th</sup> Generation lines are filled on your *MINISTRY MAP*, you will have a total of **15 multipliers** for the Kingdom!

When we began, there was **one** line filled. One multiplier for the Kingdom — YOU. But instead of you only continuing to add people you are directly discipling, you began to train and **WORK THROUGH** the new 2<sup>nd</sup> Generation disciples so that they also made disciples and began to equip the 3<sup>rd</sup> generation. You **multiplied** instead of **added!** You didn’t ONLY keep having “children in the faith,” but you also equipped those new believers to have “children in the faith” of their own! You became a “spiritual grandfather!” Then, as the 3<sup>rd</sup> Generation multiplied, you became a “spiritual great-grandfather” as the 4<sup>th</sup> Generation of multipliers were won to faith and trained by the 3<sup>rd</sup> Generation!

This is how **exponential multiplication** works. It is **much more powerful** than addition! With each generation, we multiply multipliers!

It is best to track this to the **4<sup>th</sup> Generation** using the *MINISTRY MAP*. When the multipliers whom you train continue to multiply multipliers to **their own** 4<sup>th</sup> Generation, this process will be established as a normal part of following Jesus Christ (as it should be)!


Make sure that **each individual** of **each generation** begins **their own** *MINISTRY MAP* (any blank paper may be used as their *MINISTRY MAP*) to track multiplication and assure that it continues.


This is the heart of the Great Commission. As you work with others on a team, you will learn to lead people to faith in Jesus and make multiplying disciples — to the 4<sup>th</sup> Generation! You will obey and help fulfill Jesus’ Great Commission! He will use you as part of His great plan to reach your lost world!

1. Who are other believers that you will partner with to make multiplying disciples?
  
2. Who are people in your world that you will pray for, initiate spiritual conversations with, ask to share your story and the Gospel with? (Friends, family members, neighbors, co-workers, etc). Who will you go to first?
  
3. Are there new believers that you can begin to use the *STRATEGIC IMPACT DISCIPLESHIP TOOL* to help them become multiplying disciplers now?
  
4. Send updates during the last week of each month to your pastor or local *STRATEGIC IMPACT* leader.
  - A. How many people did you lead to make a new profession of faith in Jesus?
  
  - B. How many new people are you now personally discipling?







# STATEMENT OF FAITH

## GOD

*Genesis 1:1; Deuteronomy 6:4; Matthew 28:19; John 4:24, 10:30; 2 Corinthians 13:14*

We believe that there is one true, holy God, eternally existing in three persons — Father, Son and Holy Spirit — each of whom possesses equally all the attributes of deity and the characteristics of personality. In the beginning God created out of nothing the world and all the things therein, thus manifesting the glory of His power, wisdom and goodness. By His sovereign power He continues to sustain His creation. By His providence He is operating throughout history to fulfill His redemptive purposes.

## JESUS CHRIST

*Matthew 20:28; Acts 4:12; Romans 5:10; 2 Corinthians 5:18-19; 1 John 2:2*

Jesus Christ is the eternal second Person of the Trinity who was united forever with a true human nature by a miraculous conception and virgin birth. He lived a life of perfect obedience to the Father and voluntarily atoned for (made a payment for) the sins of all by dying on the cross as their substitute, thus satisfying divine justice and accomplishing salvation and eternal life for all who trust in Him alone. He rose from the dead in the same body, though glorified, in which He lived and died. He ascended to heaven, and sat down at the right hand of the Father, where He, the only Mediator between God and man, continually makes intercession for His own. He shall come again to earth, personally and visibly, to consummate history and the eternal plan of God.

## THE HOLY SPIRIT and THE CHRISTIAN LIFE

*John 15:26, 16:8-11*

The natural accompaniment of a genuine saving relationship with Jesus Christ is a life of holiness and obedience, attained by believers as they submit to the Holy Spirit, the third Person of the Trinity. He was sent into the world by the Father and the Son to apply to mankind the saving work of Christ. He enlightens the minds of sinners, awakens in them a recognition of their need of a Savior and regenerates them (gives them new life). At the point of salvation He permanently indwells every believer to become the source of assurance, strength and wisdom, and He uniquely endows each believer with gifts for the building up of the body. The Holy Spirit guides believers in understanding and applying the Scripture. His power and control are applied by faith, making it possible for the believer to lead a life of Christlike character and to bear fruit to the glory of the Father.

## THE BIBLE

*2 Timothy 3:16; 2 Peter 1:21*

The sole basis of our belief is the Bible, composed of the sixty-six books of the Old and New Testament. We believe that the Scripture in its entirety originated with God, and that it was given through the instrumentality of chosen men. Scripture thus one and at the same time speaks with the authority of God and reflects the backgrounds, styles and vocabularies of the human authors. We hold that the Scriptures are infallible and without error in the original manuscripts. They are the unique, full and final authority on all matters of faith and practice, and there are no other writings similarly inspired by God.

## **SALVATION**

*Romans 3:23; 5:8; Ephesians 2:1, 8-9*

The central purpose of God's revelation in Scripture is to call all people into fellowship with Himself. Originally created to have fellowship with God, man defied God, choosing to go his independent way, and was thus alienated from God and suffered the corruption of his nature, rendering him unable to please God. The fall of man took place at the beginning of human history, and all individuals since have suffered these consequences and are thus in need of the saving grace of God. The salvation of mankind is, then, wholly a work of God's free grace, not the result, in whole or in part of human works or goodness, and must be received by faith on an individual basis. When God has begun a saving work in the heart of any person, He gives assurance in the Bible that He will continue performing it until the day of its full consummation.

## **HUMAN DESTINY**

*1 Thessalonians 4:16-17; Hebrews 9:27*

Death seals the eternal destiny of each person. For all mankind, there will be a resurrection of the body into the spiritual world, and a judgment that will determine the fate of each individual. There is an eternal state of punishment for the unsaved and an eternal state of blessing for the saved. Those who have trusted Christ will be received into eternal communion with God and will be rewarded for works done in life.

## **THE CHURCH**

*Acts 2:42; Romans 12:1-6*

The result of union with Jesus Christ is that all believers become members of His body, the church. There is one true church universal, comprised of all those who have trusted Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord. The Scripture commands believers to gather together to devote themselves to worship, prayer, teaching of the Bible, observance of baptism and communion as the ordinances established by Jesus Christ, fellowship, service to the body through development and use of talents and gifts, and outreach to the world. Wherever God's people meet regularly in obedience to this command, there is the local expression of the church. Under the watch care of elders and other supportive leadership, its members are to work together in love and unity, intent upon the ultimate purpose of exalting Christ for the glory of God and the fulfillment of Christ's Great Commission.

## **FAITH and PRACTICE**

*1 Corinthians 10:24, 31; 2 Timothy 3:16-17*

Scripture is the final authority in all matters of faith and practice. We recognize that it cannot bind the conscience of individuals in areas where Scripture is silent. Rather, each believer is to be led in those areas by the Lord, to whom he or she alone is ultimately responsible.



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
